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INTRODUCTION

This study was conducted for Trevor Poulton, Lindsay Hesketh, Nick Adams
- members of ALP Otway Ranges Interest Group (a non-constituent unit of
the ALP), et al by Irving Saulwick and Associates.

It was designed to study the attitudes of Corangamite voters to the clearfelling of native forests in the Otways.

To meet this objective a random sample of 800 Corangamite voters were interviewed between 20th and 22nd September, 2001.

The questionnaire used is included in Appendix 1.

SUMMARY OF MAIN FINDINGS

1. A substantial majority of electors in Corangamite oppose the clearfelling of native forests in the Otways.

69% of all voters oppose it, of whom half (35%) oppose it strongly. I9% of all voters support it, of whom only 3% support it strongly.

2. Opposition to clearfell logging is drawn from all the main parties:

60% of Coalition voters oppose it,

76% of Labor voters oppose it,

89% of Democrat voters oppose it, and

100% of Greens voters oppose it.

72% of voters yet to determine who they will vote for (21% of all voters) are opposed to it

- 3. Majority opposition is also drawn from people of both sexes, all age groups, all occupation groups, and all education groups. 84% of 18-24 year olds oppose it, while only 9% support it.
- 4. Opposition is most widespread among people who live in the coastal towns (79%) and on the peninsular (76%), followed by Geelong residents (70%), and then by rural residents (54%). Only in Colac is there less than 50% of voters who oppose clearfelling, but even here more oppose it (45%) than support it (38%).
- 5. A substantial minority of voters say that if either the Labor party or the Liberal National parties were to announce a move to end clearfell logging of native forest in the Otways this would make them more likely to vote for them.

34% of all voters and 41% of swinging voters assert this,

21% of Liberal voters and 31% of swinging Liberal voters assert this,

39% of Labor voters and 40% of swinging Labor voters assert this,

64% of Democrat voters and 74% of swinging Democrat voters assert this,

67% of Greens voters and 64% of swinging Greens voters assert this, and

50% of other parties voters assert this.

43% of voters who don't know for whom they will vote and 47% of swinging voters who don't know for whom they will vote also assert this.

Only 5% of all voters would be less likely to vote for a party who advocated the ending of clearfell logging.

6. 49% of Corangamite voters may be defined as swinging voters – that is, voters who have voted for more than one party in a State or Federal election.

The groups most likely to be swinging voters include voters aged 18-24 (59%) and University educated voters (60%).

Groups least likely to be swinging voters include people who are recorded as 'home duties' (39%) and those who are 'retired/pensioners' (38%).

8. On a two-party preferred basis, the Liberal/National Party leads Labor 54% to 46%.
